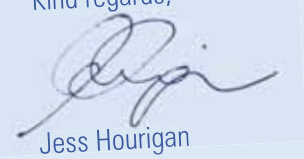

In the 1920s and 1930s, a concern for 'racial purity' and the doctrine of Eugenics became a common obsession in Australia and many other countries. This program, presented by Aaron Pederson, explores early views on race and the attitudes of both black and white people. Aden Ridgeway, Henry Reynolds and other key figures discuss the methods used to assimilate Indigenous people such as removing children from Aboriginal families, segregation, settlements and reserves, access only to low paid menial work and the social upheaval and trauma caused by such policies and practices.

On the 27th October 2006 Anangu Pitjantjatjara Yankunytjatjara peoples came together with guests at a Cultural Festival in Umuwa South Australia to celebrate the 25th anniversary of the passing of the Pitjantjatjara Land Rights Act 1981. This marked the beginning of a new deal for Aborigines/Torres Strait Islanders in Australia, and became a yardstick upon which all other claims have since been measured.

The program focuses on the developments that lead to the Land Act and how the communities in the lands of North West of South Australia came worked together.

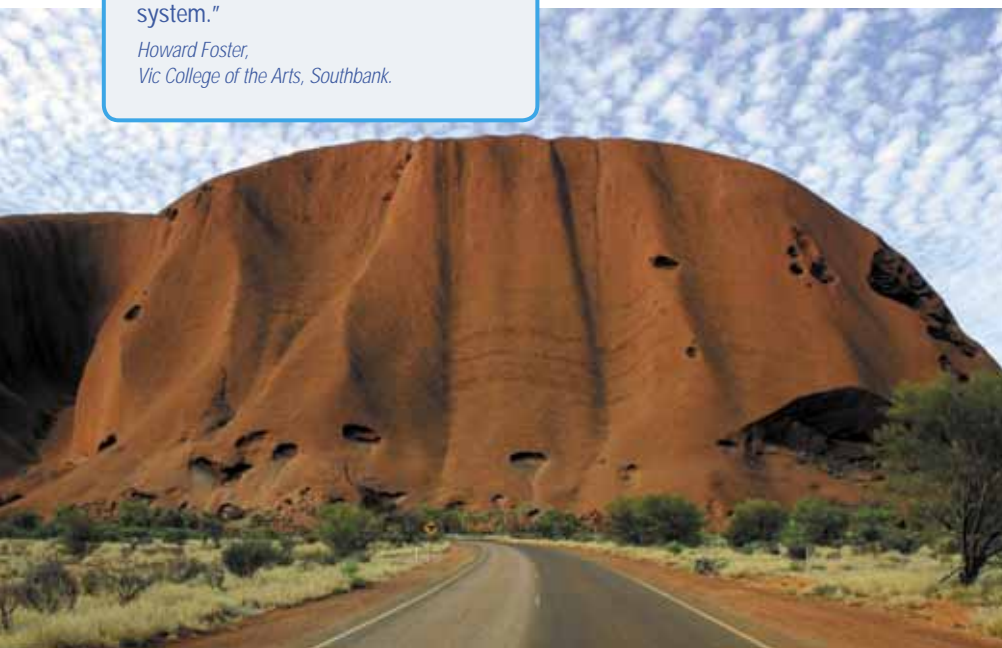

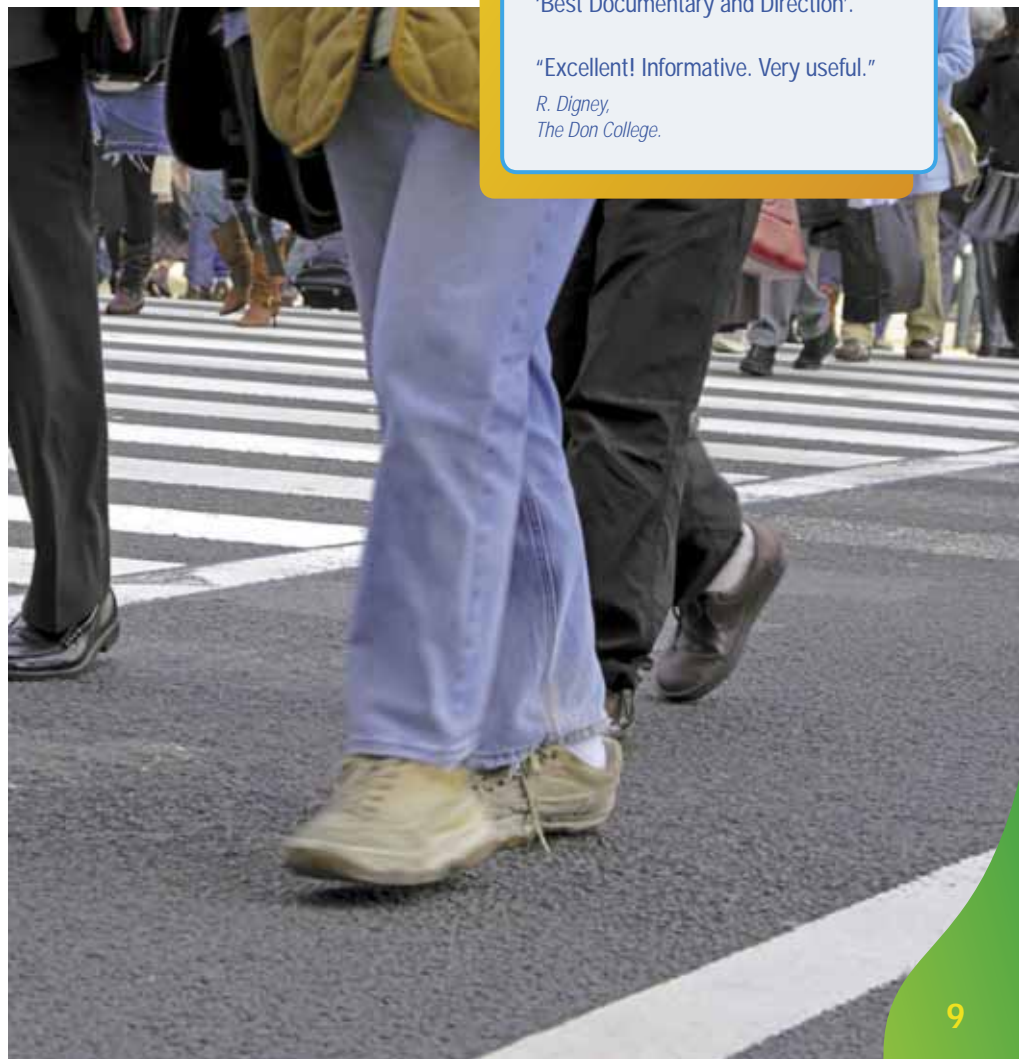
